Instructions for the Macro Field Paper

Deadline: July 29, 2016

Instructions:

- 1. The paper should be 20 to 30 pages long with one and a half spacing.
- 2. A minimum requirement is a critical survey paper on an area of the literature that was covered in one of the three classes, in the spirit of papers found in the *Journal of Economic Literature*. In that case, you should conclude with a section that provides some motivation for a new paper, or potential avenues for future research. You can describe the sketch of a model, a new motivating "stylized fact", etc.
- 3. Creative ideas are encouraged ranging from theory papers to empirical papers including replication of existing work on new data sets.
- 4. In the past, students have expanded on a paper that was submitted for one of the three classes. That is fine. Developing a paper out of a challenging homework exercise is also fine.
- Students should avoid submitting the same paper, or a close variant of it, for two fields:
 e.g. Theory and macro, macro and international.
- 6. Papers should be written in clear English and free of grammatical and spelling errors.
