Requirements for Either Field

Students may choose to take either the Macro/Monetary field or the International field and they may be taken independently. Requirements in either field are:

- Course work: Students must pass 3 courses in each field with a grade of B or better.
- **Second Year Paper:** Every student must write a field paper by the end of the second year and receive a passing grade. The topic may be chosen from any one of the courses that make up the field. Students taking both fields must write two separate papers, one for each field.
 - International field paper requirement: before the end of the Spring quarter, students must present a 2-3 page proposal for the field paper that must be approved by one faculty in the field

Students must receive a passing grade in their field paper before advancing to candidacy.

Additional Guidelines

- At the end of the summer every student is expected to advance to candidacy (ATC) by presenting an oral defense of a thesis topic to a committee. That committee should consist of a main advisor, two additional faculty members from the Economics Department and one external member from an outside department. Normally, a dissertation topic for Macro or International will build on one of the field papers presented either in the Macro or International fields. Students are strongly recommended to choose a main advisor at the beginning of the summer. That advisor will guide the student through the ATC process and help pick the other members of the committee.
- Students are required to attend the Macro/International pro-seminar
- Students in Macro/International are **required** to attend the Macro/International departmental seminar each week.
